Requirements for students matriculating Fall 2021 and after

I. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance degree program is for students seeking careers as professional dance artists. Students pursue their goals within the artistic and intellectual climate of a major research university and work with a diverse group of accomplished faculty who ensure expert direction in all three areas of the curriculum: performance and choreography, pedagogy, and dance theory. Students applying to the BFA in dance must submit an application to Mason Gross School of the Arts and participate in an audition.

Just 45 minutes from New York City, Mason Gross Dance enrolls a cohort of approximately 30-35 students each year in the BFA degree program. BFA dance majors pursue their studies in a dedicated community that prioritizes their development as future artists, educators, and scholars. Students are guided to extend and refine their artistic potential through work in multiple studios and performance facilities. The Dance Department regularly hosts dance companies, dance practitioners, and scholars who are internationally renowned in the field, offering students opportunities to work side-byside on the stage and in the classroom with professional choreographers, dance educators, and dance scholars.

II. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- i. Guest Artist and Scholars: Mason Gross Dance invites multiple guest artists and scholars to campus each year to engage students through repertory residencies, master classes, and guest lectures.
- ii. The Soma Center and Somatic Teacher Training: In the fully-equipped Soma Center, students access Pilates conditioning with certified practitioners, and strength training and rehabilitation with a licensed Athletic Trainer. Students can pursue two distinct somatic teacher training programs—in Pilates and Yoga—which allows them to enhance their career options through specialized knowledge and skills.
- iii. 5-Year BFA/EdM in Dance Education Program: This joint-degree track is an exceptional opportunity to earn an undergraduate degree in dance in a conservatory setting and a master's degree in education in five years at a cost savings. Students on the five-year BFA/EdM track overlap degree requirements at two different schools: Mason Gross School of the Arts and Rutgers Graduate School of Education (GSE). The BFA degree is conferred by Mason Gross at the end of the senior year. The EdM degree is conferred by the GSE after an additional year of graduate studies. The five-year program leads to a bachelor's degree, a master's degree, and New Jersey teacher certification in Dance.

- iv. Study Abroad: BFA juniors and seniors may study abroad. Options include: the DanceJerusalem program in Israel, which is facilitated by the Rothberg International School, Hebrew University and the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance; the Accademia dell'Arte program in Arezzo, Tuscany, Italy; or the Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance in London, United Kingdom.
- v. Dance & Parkinson's Program: Mason Gross Dance partners with the New Jersey Parkinson's Disease Information and Referral Center at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital to provide movement classes for people with Parkinson's disease. Students interested in careers in dance therapy and/or dance as a mode of creative wellness have opportunities to gain experiential learning through participation as assistants.
- vi. International Dance Studies online certificate (4 courses): BFA undergraduate students can cultivate historical and cultural contextualization of world dance practices through elective dance studies courses about India, Istanbul, Israel, Africa and the African diasporic influence on Broadway jazz. As BFA students are required to complete Dance History: World Survey in their 3rd year (spring semester), completing the Certificate requires only 3 additional courses from the 5 listed above.
- **III. HOW TO APPLY:** To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following:
 - 1. Rutgers University Application: <u>Rutgers University Application</u>. The university application requires the following:
 - a. \$70 Rutgers application fee
 - b. Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) for current high school students
 - c. Official high school transcript or GED results recommended for all transfer applicants, required for transfer applicants who, after high school graduation, have completed fewer than 24 college credits.
 - d. English proficiency test scores international applicants
 - e. SAT or ACT scores are **optional** for applicants to the 2021 admissions cycle use code 2765 for the SAT and 2592 for the ACT
 - 2. Mason Gross Supplemental Application: Five business days after submitting the Rutgers University application, applicants will be emailed a link to submit a Mason Gross supplemental application that includes:
 - a. \$40 dance audition fee
 - b. Dance questionnaire
 - c. Resume and headshot
 - d. Recorded audition video (outlined below)
 - e. Optional video Original choreographies, solo performances in dance forms of any kind, etc.
 - f. Interview and Information Session

IV. BFA Dance Major Curriculum: Students must complete a minimum of 120-degree credits to earn the BFA Degree in Dance. 99 Dance credits (including 8 credits of Dance electives) and 33 credits of liberal arts, 4-year program. Minimum GPA requirement: 2.0. Students must earn a C grade or better in the required Dance courses or repeat the course. Students must be registered for a minimum of 12 credits each semester to achieve full-time status.
