Requirements for students matriculating Fall 2021 and after

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance degree program is for students seeking careers as professionals in the dance field. Students pursue their goals within the artistic and intellectual climate of a major research university and work with a diverse group of accomplished faculty who ensure expert direction in technique and performance, choreography, and theoretical studies. Students applying to the BFA in Dance must submit an application to Mason Gross School of the Arts and participate in an audition.

The Dance Department offers a distinctive, impactful curriculum that centers diversity, equity, and inclusion across various movement expressions. Our goal is to provide students with an exceptional education in equitable approaches to dance training, dance scholarship, and dance-making. We take this step to open our program to prospective students with diverse proficiencies in dance and to give our students access to an expanded range of careers in the evolving field of dance.

I. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- i. **Guest Artist and Scholars:** Mason Gross Dance invites multiple guest artists and scholars to campus each year to engage students through repertory residencies, master classes, and guest lectures.
- ii. **The Soma Center and Somatic Teacher Training:** In the fully-equipped Soma Center, students access Pilates conditioning with certified practitioners, and strength training and rehabilitation with a licensed Athletic Trainer. Students can pursue two distinct somatic teacher training programs—in Pilates and Yoga—which allows them to enhance their career options through specialized knowledge and skills.
- iii. **Five-Year BFA/EdM in Dance Education Program:** This joint-degree track is an exceptional opportunity to earn an undergraduate degree in dance in a conservatory setting and a master's degree in education in five years at a cost savings. Students on the five-year BFA/EdM track overlap degree requirements at two different schools: Mason Gross School of the Arts and Rutgers Graduate School of Education (GSE). The BFA degree is conferred by Mason Gross at the end of the senior year. The [EdM degree](#) is conferred by the GSE after an additional year of graduate studies. The five-year program leads to a bachelor's degree, a master's degree, and New Jersey teacher certification in Dance.

- iv. **Study Abroad:** BFA juniors and seniors may study abroad. Options include: the DanceJerusalem program in Israel, which is facilitated by the Rothberg International School, Hebrew University and the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance; the Accademia dell'Arte program in Arezzo, Tuscany, Italy, The Camping Festival; Lyon, France; or the Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance in London, United Kingdom.
- v. **Movement classes through the Integrated Dance Collaboratory (IDC)** The Mason Gross School of the Arts Integrated Dance Collaboratory (IDC) researches and promotes the role of dance as an effective intervention for public health, wellness, education, and the professionalization of integrated dance arts. Students concentrating in dance science have opportunities to gain experiential learning as assistants, or participants, in 2 distinct movement programs for the community: Dance for Parkinson's and Neuromuscular Conditions and Movement Class for Neurodivergent People.

III. HOW TO APPLY: To be considered for admission to the program, applicants must provide the following:

1. Rutgers University Application: [Rutgers University Application](#). The university application requires the following:
 - a. \$70 Rutgers application fee
 - b. Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) – for current high school students
 - c. Official high school transcript or GED results – recommended for all transfer applicants, required for transfer applicants who, after high school graduation, have completed fewer than 24 college credits.
 - d. English proficiency test scores are required of [international applicants](#)
 - e. SAT or ACT scores are optional for applicants - use code 2765 for the SAT and 2592 for the ACT
2. Mason Gross Supplemental Application: Five business days after submitting the Rutgers University application, applicants will be emailed a link to submit a Mason Gross supplemental application that includes:
 - a. \$40 dance audition fee
 - b. Dance questionnaire
 - c. Resume and headshot
 - d. Recorded audition video (outlined below)
 - e. Optional video – Original choreographies, solo performances in dance forms of any kind, etc.
 - f. Interview and information session

IV. BFA Dance Major Curriculum: Students must complete a minimum of 120 credits to earn the BFA Degree in Dance. This includes 99 Dance credits (including 8 credits of Dance electives) and 33 credits of liberal arts, over a 4-year program. Minimum GPA requirement: 2.0. **Students must earn a C grade or better in the core curriculum (see table below) or repeat the course. Students must be registered for a minimum of 12 credits each semester to achieve full-time status.**
