PROGRAM NOTES

Escobar Composer's Note:

Escobar is a Spanish-language grand opera about Colombian drug lord Pablo Escobar, whose boundless ambition launched him to greatness and threw the lives of his family, his associates, and his country into chaos. He is pursued by police commander Hugo Martínez, who himself is pushed to increasingly violent means to justify a peaceful end.

The story of Pablo Escobar has been widely retold in film, television, fiction and non-fiction books. His life has been mythologized internationally by those who admired him and those who hated him alike. For this reason, we believe that opera, as a larger-than-life medium, is an ideal way to further explore his life and the impact it had on the people around him and his country. High-stakes drama, complicated romances, tragedy and triumph all characterize Escobar, set to a sumptuous score that will captivate and entice both experienced opera-goers and newcomers.

Alice Tierney Composer's Note:

A few years ago, while researching the history of my home in Philadelphia, I uncovered newspaper reports of a 45-year-old "dissipated woman" named Alice Tierney who was found strangled and strung up on a fence on my property on a cold January night in 1880. Shockingly, Tierney's death was written up by contemporary police and the press as an accident. I pledged to find a way to tell Alice's story, which resonates in the 21st century when our culture is actively grappling with the ways in which women's stories of trauma are silenced or minimized, especially those of vulnerable and poor women.

What little we know about Alice is dimmed by the passage of 140 years and hampered by a lack of written records about those who lived on the fringes of society. Librettist Jacqueline Goldfinger and I opted to tell Alice's story from the perspectives of four modern-day archeologists who piece together Alice Tierney's life while excavating the place where she lived and died. Their different perspectives show that the telling of history says just as much about the narrator as the narrative. What assumptions, experiences, prejudices, knowledge, and personalities do these four archeologists bring to their research, which affect the way they see and conceive of Alice Tierney? Attempting to answer this question delves into big issues like truth, justice, and equality. For hundreds of years, American history (and indeed, opera) has been primarily told by one demographic. Including marginalized perspectives is a challenge, but gives us a fuller picture of the past and ourselves.

STAFF BIOS

Matteo Neri (*Escobar* Composer) has a versatile musical background, with experience in composing operas, classical concert music, and music for visual media. His most significant work, a new Spanish-language grand opera, *Escobar*, is in development with Florida Grand Opera. Matteo was a composer for Comma Music, a leading music house for visual media from 2016 to 2018. His film credits include *The Kicking Yoda*, which received the award for Best Documentary Short at the Los Angeles Film Awards. Matteo's compositions have been performed by many ensembles and organizations, including the Austin Opera Orchestra, Momenta Quartet, Helix! New Music Ensemble, and Source Song Festival.

Melissa Dunphy (Alice Tierney Composer) first came to national attention when her large-scale work *The Gonzales Cantata* was featured in *The Wall Street Journal* and on *The Rachel Maddow Show*. Commissions include works for Experiments in Opera, the BBC Singers, VOCES8, and Cantus. Dunphy is also a Barrymore Award-nominated theater composer and Director of Music Composition for the O'Neill National Puppetry Conference. She has a PhD from the University of Pennsylvania and a BM from West Chester University and teaches at Rutgers University. She lives in Philadelphia with her husband, Matt; the Dunphys are cohosts of the popular podcast *The Boghouse* about citizen archaeology.

Kynan Johns (Conductor) was hailed by *The New York Times* as 'incisive, first rate and brilliant'. A protégé of Lorin Maazel, Johns has conducted over 100 orchestras, including the Israel Philharmonic, Rotterdam Philharmonic, Cleveland Orchestra, Wiener Kammerorchester, Philarmonica della Scala, Netherlands Radio Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Symphony Orchestra, and the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra. He has worked at Covent Garden and conducted at La Scala. Former Resident Conductor of the Palau de les Arts, Valencia, music staff with the New York City opera, Johns currently serves as Principal guest conductor for the Orquesta Clásica Santa Cecilia, Madrid, in addition to his duties at Rutgers. He has worked with world renowned artists such as Placido Domingo, Zubin Mehta, Maurice André, Aldo Ciccolini, Vadim Repin, Julian Rachlin, Marina Poplovskaya, Peter Donohoe and Barbara Frittoli. In 2001, he was awarded the inaugural 'Centenary Medal' from the Australian Government, conferred by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, for his services to the community through music.

Christopher Beckett (Assistant Conductor) is a graduate of the Mason Gross School of Arts at Rutgers University, holding a B.M. in Music Education with concentration in violin and viola. He is currently a candidate for an M.M. in Conducting at Mason Gross under Maestro Kynan Johns. Mr. Beckett has served as the director of the Preparatory Strings and Concert Orchestra for the Greater Princeton Youth Orchestra and conducted numerous other ensembles, including the Harlem Quartet Workshop Orchestra, NJ Arco Youth Orchestra, and the NJ High School Region II Orchestra. He has performed at the Kimmel Center, Carnegie Hall, and Gordon Hall. In 2019, he led an international viola masterclass at Universidad Nacional de Colombia. Mr. Becket is currently in his tenth year of teaching strings in the East Brunswick school district. He is very excited to conduct the Helix! Ensemble.

HELIX! (*Alice Tierney* Instrumentalists) is the resident new music ensemble at Rutgers. A modular group, highly adept and versatile, with a Pierrot ensemble at its core, HELIX! focuses solely on the music of living composers. From solo works to works for 16 players, HELIX! can adapt to the needs of almost any piece. World premieres by Rutgers faculty and students, along with works by leading composers worldwide who are defining new trends in composition are the ensemble's staple.

Carlos Avila (*Escobar* Performance Pianist, *Alice Tierney* and *Escobar* Repetiteur), hailed for his "beautiful command of tone and mood, and unruffleable savoirfaire" (San Francisco Chronicle), Carlos Avila is one of the most in-demand pianists on the classical music scene. An avid collaborative musician, Carlos has appeared in the chamber music series of The New York Philharmonic, The Chicago Symphony Orchestra, The San Francisco Symphony, and The Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra among others. He has also served on the faculties of The Juilliard School, New York University, The Heifetz International Music Institute, the Chautauqua Institution, Morningside Music Bridge, and Orford Musique. His early mentors have included Isaac Stern at "Stern Encounters", Daniel Barenboim at the Carnegie Hall Workshops, and Michael Tilson Thomas. A proud Filipino-American, Carlos is a graduate of The Juilliard School. Prior studies include Yale University. He currently resides in New York City.

Saffron Y. Chung (Vocal Coach) was born in Seoul, Korea, and now considers New York City her home. She chose her path in music early at Oberlin College, where she was the first recipient of a double major in Piano Performance and Vocal Accompanying. She also has Master of Music degree in Accompanying from University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music. She has served as an assistant conductor of opera companies such as Chautauqua Opera, El Paso Opera, Florida Grand Opera, Glimmerglass Opera, Madison Opera, New York City Opera, Sarasota Opera, Syracuse Opera and Utah Festival Opera Company, Wichita Grand Opera, under the baton of Harry Bickett, Richard Buckley, Christian Capocaccia, Barbara Day-Turner, Victor De Renzi, John DeMain, Raymond Harvey, Kynan Johns, Eugene Kohn, David Larsen, Robert Lyall, Stewart Robertson, Louis Salemno, Steven Sloane, Bob Tweeten, and Steven White. Saffron has worked as a vocal coach and accompanist, preparing hundreds of singers for auditions, concerts, opera performances and recitals. Aside from the standard classical operatic and art song repertoire, she specializes in contemporary opera.
