CANDIDE

A collaborative production of Opera Theater Rutgers and with Rutgers Theater Company, Candide is an operetta with music by Leonard Bernstein. The story is based on Voltaire's 1759 satire, which follows the increasingly far-flung, globe-trotting journeys of Candide and Cunégonde as their optimism is tested through nonstop catastrophe. Many hands contributed to the spoken text and lyrics of the operetta, from its premiere in 1956 through several revivals.

Candide will run 2 hours and 45 minutes, with one 20-minute intermission.

ABOUT RUTGERS OPERA THEATER

Rutgers Opera Theater at the Mason Gross School of the Arts provides young vocal artists the opportunity to engage vigorously and virtuosically with both canonical opera repertoire and new work. Rutgers Opera Theater stages multiple productions every season, ranging from workshop productions of brand new operas, to scenes programs, to contemporary chamber pieces, to classic operas with full orchestra. Students are taught by an accomplished group of professional artists through on-stage, in-production learning, course work, and studio instruction. The department offers Bachelors of Music and Masters degrees, as well as Artist Diplomas and Doctorates of Musical Arts.

The Mason Gross School of the Arts Theater Department combines rigorous studio class work with a demanding production schedule to provide students with in-depth training and practice in theater. PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

Micaela Aldridge (Old Lady - DMA/1st year, Voice Performance) is a mezzo-soprano from Montclair, New Jersey. Her most recent credits include Diana Turbay in *Escobar* (Rutgers Opera), The Composer in *Ariadne auf Naxos* (Taconic Opera), and Octet of Souls in *Sensorium Ex* (Beth Morrison Projects). She holds a BM from Oberlin Conservatory and an MM from the University of Michigan, where she was a recipient of the Jessye Norman Graduate Fellowship in Voice.

Abdon Andahur (Baron/Bear Keeper, Chorus - BM II, music education) is a native of North Plainfield, New Jersey. Opera Theater Rutgers credits include Chorus in *La Bohème*. A classically-trained baritone, Andahur currently studies under Susan Quittmeyer. Aside from performing occasionally, Andahur is passionate about conducting, instrumental music, performance art, and music direction.

Lauren Barchi (Sultan Achmet/ Chorus- DMA III, voice performance) is a soprano from New York. Opera Theater Rutgers credits: Lyra (*Alice Tierney*), Mimì (*La Bohème*), Contessa (*Le nozze di Figaro*), Blanche (*Dialogues des Carmélites*), and Lady Billows (*Albert Herring*). She received her BM in Vocal Performance and Music Education from Ithaca College, her MM in Vocal Performance and Pedagogy from NYU, and her AD in Opera from Rutgers University.

Nava Chefitz (Chorus - BFA, visual arts) is an alto from New Jersey. She is currently in her third year at Mason Gross double concentrating in painting and photography, but is a proud member of the Rutgers University choir. Nava has been dancing and doing theater since she was very young, but this is her very first opera and she could not be more excited! Yay Candide!

Manasvi Chilakapati (Ensemble) is from Boston, Massachusetts. She will receive her BA in cognitive neuroscience and linguistics from Rutgers University School of Arts and Sciences.

Youjin Cho (Chorus - DMA II, voice performance) is a soprano originally from South Korea. She holds an MM in Vocal Performance from Rutgers University and a BM in Vocal Performance from Seoul National University. Youjin's highlighted performances include Giulietta in *Tales of Hoffmann*, Norina in *Don Pasquale*, Giorgetta in *Il Tabarro*, Susannah in *Susannah*, Pamina and First lady in *Die Zauberflöte*, Violetta in *La Traviata*, and Servilia in *La Clemenza di Tito*.

Kira de Oliveira (Chorus/Alchemist/King Hermann/Crook – BM, vocal performance) is a mezzo-soprano from Ithaca, New York. They are a junior at Mason Gross School of the Arts and are currently studying under the guidance of Professor Judith Nicosia. Vincent Graña (Pangloss/Cacambo/Martin - DMA III, vocal performance) hails from Jersey City, New Jersey. He received his BM in music education from Rutgers University. Opera Theater Rutgers credits include Kiko in *Escobar*, Colline in *La Bohème*, and Bottom in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Professional credits include Chorus in *Lohengrin* and *Der Fliegende Holländer* (The Metropolitan Opera), Mirabolano in *Crispino e la Comare* (Teatro Nuovo) and Colline in *La Bohème* (Dayton Opera, Opera Santa Barbara).

Amina Goldenberg (James the Anabaptist - BM I, vocal performance) is a soprano from Queens, New York.

Natalie Hanaway (Voltaire – BFA I) is from Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Other performance credits include Peggy Sawyer for *42nd Street* and Hodel for *Fiddler on the Roof* at Shorewood High School.

Ziliang Hao (Doctor/Inquisitor II/Croupier— DMA III vocal performance) is a bassbaritone from Beijing, China. He earned his master's degree in voice and opera from the Mannes School of Music and holds a bachelor's degree in acting and opera from the Central Academy of Drama in Beijing, China. His recent roles include Massetto in *Don Giovanni*, Crespel, Luther, and Schlemil in *The Tales of Hoffmann*, Colline in *La Bohème*, Theseus in *A Midsummer Night Dream*, and Zuniga in *Carmen*.

Stef Haas (Chorus - BM IV, Music Education - Instrumental) is from Glen Rock, New Jersey. They attend Mason Gross School of the Arts and study trombone. Stef sings bass in University Choir and Rainbow Symphony Choir. Stef has performed with NJ Vocal Arts Collaborative's production of *Die Zauberflöte*, Rutgers Symphony Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Bones. Phillip Hsieh (Governor/Vanderdendur/Ragotski/Chorus - Visiting Scholar) is from Taiwan, Taipei National University of the Arts DMA candidate, Fulbright Non-Academic Professional Grant 2023-24. Opera Credits include Vogelsang in *Der Schauspieldirektor*, Beppe in *Rita*, Goro in *Madama Butterfly*, Gaston in *La Traviata*. Producer for the opera works, *The Old Maid and the Thief*, *Il segreto di Susanna*, *Help*, *Help*, *the Globolinks!* and *Faust*.

Lu Huang (Chorus- AD I, opera performance) is a soprano from Beijing, China. She obtained her bachelor's, master's, and DMA degrees at the China Conservatory of Music in Beijing, China. Before coming to the United States, Ms. Lu was a renowned concert musician, highly regarded for her expertise in researching and performing Chinese art songs and ethnic music. She frequently held solo recitals in many of China's premier concert halls.

Caitlyn Huetz (Baroness/Cosmetic Merchant - BM IV, vocal performance) is a soprano from Maplewood, NJ and is currently studying under Judith Nicosia. Her previous roles at Opera Theater Rutgers include Alice 1 in Melissa Dunphy's *Alice Tierney*, Mrs. Gobineau in Menotti's *The Medium*, and *La Bohème*.

Yeawon Jun (Cunegonde – DMA III, vocal performance) is a soprano from Seoul, South Korea. Mason Gross School of the Arts credits include Titania in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Musetta in *La Bohème*. Professional credits include Sophie in *Werther*, Luigia in *Viva la mamma*, Musetta in *La Bohème*, Mimi in *La Bohème*, and Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni*.

Heejae Kim (Candide – DMA II, vocal performance) from Seoul, Korea. He received his BM from Seoul National University, MM from Mannes School of Music, and Certification in Boston University Opera Institute. Opera Theater Rutgers credits include Rodolfo in *La Bohème*, John in *Alice Tierney*. Professional credits include Don Ramiro in *La Cenerentola* (New York City Opera), Edgardo in *Lucia di Lammermoor*, and Alfredo in *La Traviata* (Seoul Metropolitan Opera).

Rebecca Kornhaber (Ensemble - BM III, vocal performance) is from Flemington, New Jersey. Her previous role at Mason Gross was as an Ensemble member for *La Bohème*. Before opera, she was largely involved in theater throughout her teen years, performing in numerous plays and musicals. She looks forward to furthering her studies at Mason Gross.

Hyune Kwon (Chorus – DMA II, vocal performance) is from Seoul, South Korea. She received an MM from Mannes College of Performing Arts, and a BM from Yonsei University. Mason Gross School of Arts credits include Sara in *Escobar*. Professional credits include Zerlina in *Don Giovanni* and Musetta in *La Bohème*.

Roshan Lath (Chorus - BM III, music education) is from Highland Park, New Jersey. He attends Mason Gross School of the Arts and studies piano. This is his first time participating in Opera Theater Rutgers.

Michael Lazarow (Aide/Slave Driver) is a baritone from Cherry Hill, New Jersey. He received his BM in music education from Mason Gross School of the Arts. This is Michael's first time being a part of an opera production. Previous roles include Neleus in *Mary Poppins*, Prince Eric in *The Little Mermaid*, and Raul in *The Phantom of the Opera*.

Eunjin Lee (Cunegonde – DMA I, vocal performance) is a truly expressive and magnetic coloratura soprano from Seoul, South Korea. She received her MM from Manhattan School of Music and her BM from Myongji University in South Korea. Mason Gross School of the Arts credits include Quinn in *Alice Tierney*. Other credits include Le Feu in *L'enfant et les sortilèges* (Manhattan School of Music), Frog/Pepik in *The Cunning Little Vixen* (Chautauqua Opera Conservatory), and Minerva in *Orpheus in the Underworld* (Manhattan School of Music).

Hayun Lee (Paquette - DMA II, vocal performance) is a Korean soprano based in New York. Recently, she appeared as Musetta in *La Bohème* at Rutgers Opera. Her opera credits include Despina in *Cosi fan tutte*, Ilia in *Idomeneo*, and Susanna in *Le nozze di Figaro*. She earned her BM in voice at Ewha Women's University and her master's degree at Mannes School of Music under soprano Diana Soviero and Coach Bryan Wagorn. She is pursuing her DMA at Rutgers University under the tutelage of Dawn Kotoski-Shicoff.

Susana Leiva (Tsar Ivan/ Chorus- DMA I, vocal performance) is a Chilean soprano living in Highland Park, New Jersey. Opera Theater Rutgers credits include Tata in *Escobar*, Susanna in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, Miss Wordsworth in *Albert Herring*, and Lauretta in *Gianni Schicchi*. Further credits include Alcina in Alcina (Music Academy International, Italy), Gretel in *Hansel und Gretel* (La Sierra University), Mabel in *The Pirates of Penzance* (La Sierra University), and Mary in *Oh My Son* (Southern California).

Alden Lipiarski (Chorus - BS, computer engineering) is a tenor from Glen Mills, Pennsylvania. Garnet Valley High School credits include St. Aphrodisius in *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*, Randolph MacAfee in *Bye*, *Bye*, *Birdie*, and Judge Yertle in *Seussical The Musical*.

Madeleine A. Marsola (Stanislaus, Second Officer, Chorus member – Freshman, undecided) is a soprano from Ewing, New Jersey. This is her first opera!

Inessa Martins (Chorus, First Officer- BM, Piano Performance) is from Los Angeles, California, however is a recent resident of New Brunswick. Aside from playing the piano, they also play percussion and sing in the Kirkpatrick Choir. They have performed with Voorhees Choir, Symphony Band, and the Latin American Chamber Music Ensemble at Rutgers University. This is Inessa's first experience in an opera, and they're very excited to share this production.

Emily Mautone (Chorus - BFA IV, theatre arts) is from Westfield, New Jersey. Credits include Dick in 9 to 5 (Livingston Theater Company), Mrs. Cohen/Steve in *Rent* (Livingston Theater Company), *What I Did for Love: A Musical Revue* (Cabaret Theater), Cinderella's Mother/Granny/The Giant in *Into the Woods* (Cabaret Theater), and *Same Changes: A Musical Revue* (Cabaret Theater).

Clara Marie Melvin (Chorus - BM II, vocal performance) is a soprano from Milltown, New Jersey. Opera Theater Rutgers credits Chorus in *Escobar* and Chorus in *La Bohème*.

Kat Rich (Sailor - BM II, vocal performance) is a soprano originally from Jamesburg, New Jersey. Mason Gross School of the Arts credits include Assistant Stage Manager for *La Bohème* (New Brunswick Performing Arts Center).

Will Scott (Inquisitor/Archbishop of Paris/Ensemble - BM III, music composition) is a tenor from California. This is his first opera and he's excited to take part.

Yantian Sun (Pangloss/Cacambo/Martin – AD I, opera) is a baritone from Jinan, China. Mason Gross School of the Arts credits include Matteo in *Escobar*.

Jessica Vargas (Paquette - MM I, opera) is a soprano from Brooklyn, New York, studying under Dawn Shicoff. She received her BM in vocal performance and music education from Mason Gross School of the Arts under the tutelage of Nancy Gustafson. Opera Theater Rutgers credits include Les contes d'Hoffmann (Ensemble), L'Orfeo (Euridice), A Midsummer Night's Dream (Peaseblossom), Escobar (Ensemble), and several opera scenes programs. She was also the soprano soloist in Haydn's Schöpfungsmesse with Kirkpatrick Choir.
