GENDER

Gender refers to the socially constructed attributes typically associated (particularly in the US) with being male and female, based on what is assigned at birth. However, throughout history and outside of western societies, gender is not confined to a binary (girl/woman, boy/man) nor is it static as it exists along a continuum.

Attributes and characteristics of gender are learned through socialization, but gender is actually a concept comprised of culture, identity, social norms, and expression/sense of self.
