Bachelor of Music: Music Education Concentration: Instrumental Requirement Notes

- + The total number of credits required for graduation for the Music Education Instrumental Concentration is 125.

 Because the 8 credits for Music Assembly do not count towards graduation, and the 4 credits for
 Classroom Piano (although not required) are included in the semester credit totals, the grand total of
 required course credits add up to more than 125 credits.
- ^{^^} Registration in *Music Assembly* is required in every semester of registration in Applied Major Lessons.
- Students must follow the music and Liberal Arts course requirements in effect at the time of the student's initial year of enrollment.
- * A 30-minute Senior Recital is required. The senior recital cannot be scheduled if a student has a grade of Unsatisfactory in any semester of *Music Assembly*.
- ** All Bachelor of Music students (with the exception of classical piano majors) must take the Piano Proficiency Exam by the end of the 2nd year and must pass the exam in order to graduate. Courses in piano are available to prepare students for this examination.
- Instrumentalists other than percussionists must take 1 secondary lesson in their performance area and 1 outside of their performance area. Percussion majors are required to take an additional (third) secondary lesson on a woodwind, brass, or string instrument in lieu of *Percussion Techniques*.
- One semester of *Chamber Music* is required. This requirement can be satisfied by taking the *Chamber Music* course (07:701: 355, 356, 455, or 456) or by taking one of the Small Ensembles listed in the Music Undergraduate Handbook.
- ^ These courses require field experience.
- Inclusive Learning in Music (07:700:389) must be taken in conjunction with one of the following courses that include Field Placement: 700:381, 382, 384, or 484.

- These courses—along with College Writing, 12 credits of Liberal Arts coursework with a GPA of 3.00 or higher, and passing the Piano Proficiency Exam—should be completed before the Music Education Advisory Review (MEAR). The Praxis Core Exam must be completed before MEAR (unless exempt).
- ++ It is recommended that a student complete this course before the MEAR.
- # To enroll in these courses, a student must have completed the MEAR successfully, and have been admitted into the Music Education Professional Sequence (MEPS).
- ## All degree requirements must be complete before *Clinical Practice II* (student teacher) placements are approved. Students may not be registered for any other courses during the semester in which they student teach unless pre-approved by the Director of Clinical Experience and Practice.
- > Students who take Jazz Theory I must continue on to Jazz Theory II. Students who take Theory III must continue on to Theory IV, which is offered every semester with varying topics.

- ^^ Musics and Cultures (07:700:203) is not required for students who have already completed Ethnomusicology (07:700:303) or for students who must take Ethnomusicology in the Fall 2025 semester due to schedule conflicts.
 - ! The Writing & Communication requirement must be satisfied by the specific course to which a student has been placed. Please note: College Writing Extended (01:355:104) is 4.5 credits.
